Jump Heights

Classes 1 - 20

Small and Veteran Dogs (Over 9 years on day of show) – 35cm (1ft 1.75ins)

Medium and Large Dogs – 45cm (1ft 5.7ins)

Class 21 – 35cm (1ft 1.75ins)

There will be no Tyre in any of the classes.

There will be **NO** Weaves in the Helter Skelter

Tunnel Vision Jumping – Jumps and tunnels only

Proposed order of Judging – (Subject to change)

Ring 1 – Classes, 1, 2, 5, 6, 9, 10, 19, 20, 15, 16, 21,

Ring 2 – Classes, 12, 11, 8, 7, 4, 3, 13, 14, 17, 18,

Trophies for 1st & 2nd place in each class

Rosettes – To minimum 3rd place in each class.

Best Junior Handler Rosette for each class - Please inform the pad steward if you are eligible

Best Small Starter Trophy: Classes 1 & 3

Best Medium Starter Trophy: Classes 2 & 4

Best Small Novice Trophy: Classes 5 & 7

Best Medium Novice Trophy: Classes 6 & 8

Best Small Senior Trophy: Classes 9 & 11

Best Medium Senior Trophy: Classes 10 & 12

Best Junior Trophy: Classes 1 - 4 or Classes 5 - 8 or classes 9 – 12

Each relevant class must be entered to be Eligible for the above Trophies

The Sweet Dreams Memorial Trophy: For the highest placed Veteran Dog in Classes 1 to 20.
In the case of a tie, the older dog will win.

Classification of Classes:

Grade 1 (Elementary)

For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1, (Elementary) are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 2 (Starters)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1,3,4,5,6,7, and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 3 (Graduate)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4 (Novice)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 5 (Intermediate)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6 (Senior)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7 (Advanced)

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

Jumping Pairs - Open to all.

Helter Skelter - Open to all

Tunnel Vision Jumping - Open to all.

DIRECTIONS TO VENUE:

From South: Leave A34 at Chilton (A4185). After approx 2 miles at roundabout take 3rd exit to Streatley/Pangbourne (A417)

*In Blewbury turn left into Bessels Way (B4016). Venue approx ½ mile on left. Follow drive to the end to find indoor school.

From North: Leave A34 at Milton/Didcot (A4185). After approx 2 miles at roundabout take 1st exit to Streatley/Pangbourne (A417). Follow from * above.

Show Regulations

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B.
2. The committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
3. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of the Show are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Agility Tests. Not for Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
4. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
5. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
6. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
7. Should a judge be unable to fulfill the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
8. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the Judge or Judges.
9. A judge at an Agility Test cannot compete or enter a dog at that event.
10. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half slip collar or lead when under test. A flat close fitting leather or webbing collar is permitted providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
11. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog should then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
12. No dog shall be allowed in any ring at any time other than when being judged: no practicing will be allowed in the rings.
13. The Kennel Club standard marking regulations apply.
14. It is the responsibility of the competitor to be available at the ringside for their class when required for their running order.
15. Handlers working more than one dog in a Class must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn. Failure to do so may result in elimination.
16. All dogs will be entered at this show at their owner's risk, and whilst the committee will take every reasonable care, it shall not accept responsibility for any loss, damage or injury, howsoever caused to dogs, people or property whilst at this show.
17. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the Test if it is:-
 - a) A bitch which is in season.
 - b) Suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.
 - c) Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d) Of such a temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e) Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
18. Should circumstances so dictate, the Club, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
19. Height of jump obstacles: Small dogs and veterans (over 9 years on day of show) – 35cm (1ft 1.75ins), Medium and Large dogs – 45cm (1ft 5.7ins), with the exception of the Pairs in which all dogs will jump 35cm.
20. Amount of entry £2.20 per class. Pairs £4.40. Dogs may only be entered in a maximum of 5 classes. If exceeded the dog shall be removed from the higher classification.
21. No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except a registered guide dog for the blind or hearing dog for the deaf, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee.
22. A separate application for entry must be made by each owner. Entries cannot be accepted without the appropriate fees or acceptance of the entry declaration.
23. No dog suffering from any infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing this Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
